

Community Center Advisory Committee

Purpose Statement:

The Community Center Advisory Committee is established to provide input to the Staff and Board in the final planning for the “program” that will form the core design of the community center. While no fundraising approach has been developed, yet, for this facility, the Fundraising Group will likely work with the Community Center Advisory Committee on some plans for this effort. This group performs in an advisory role and reports to the Board of Commissioners/Executive Director.

Outcomes:

1. Review the findings of VISION 20/20 in relation to the overall Critical Success Factors to better understand the context in which the Community Center fits in SPD’s future plans.
2. Review the findings of VISION 20/20 in relation to the Community Center.
3. Review the findings of the CAC Program Analysis.
4. Travel on and Participate In 2 to 4 Site Visits to Community Centers.
5. Complete planning meetings with the A/E Firm in which discussion of main programming uses for the new facility are identified and prioritized.
6. Make recommendations to the Board of Commissioners for priorities in terms of space allocation in the new Community Center.
7. Appoint one member to serve on the selection committee for an A/E Team for CAMPUS.
8. Assist the Fundraising Group with fundraising.
9. Act as a positive liaison for the park district.

Membership:

1. Pre-assigned to this committee are:

 - c. Lisa White, Recreation Supervisor
 - d. Jeanette Freeman, Office Manager
2. Individuals with an overall understanding of, appreciation for, and commitment to a BALANCED recreation program for Sycamore.

3. No hidden agendas or project specific opinions, but rather a “big picture” perspective toward indoor recreation programming.
4. A commitment to fundraising under the direction of the Fundraising Group.
5. Time to make all meetings.
6. Ability to modify schedule to attend site visits, if necessary.
7. Ability to prioritize and focus on issues.
8. Five to Seven additional individuals.
